
Homebrew 101




Staff Picks

Georgia suggests:

"The Baker's Secret" by: Stephen P. Kiernan




The story takes place in Nazi occupied
France just before D-Day, and tells of a
young apprentice baker named
Emmanuelle who inherits the business
because the Nazi's shot the baker, then tell
her they want all her bread. If she resists
she dies, and if she complies the village
starves. She covertly helps her village. It is
a story well told, documenting the events

of D-Day and the gratefulness of a village for sacrifices the Allied troops made in the name of freedom.

Oscar suggests:

"Lovecraft's Monsters" by: Ellen Datlow, ed.




This book is a short fiction anthology themed around the works of horror author H.P. Lovecraft... but you won't find any pastiches or predictable narratives here! Editor Ellen Datlow has gathered together a truly unique collection of stories (and even some poems) that explores the Lovecraft Mythos in new and surprising ways. Standout favorites

include: "Remnants" by Fred Chappell, "Waiting at the Crossroads Motel" by Steve Rasnic Tem, and "The Same Deep Waters as You" by Brian Hodge.

"An Ishmael of Syria" by: Asaad Almohammad



An Ishmael of Syria by Asaad
Almohammad is the story of Adam, an exiled Syrian living in Malaysia as his family still lives in his war-torn homeland. This powerful and thought-provoking book challenges narratives of prejudice, stereotypes and war. If you're looking for something current, semi-autobiographical, and challenging - this is the book for you.

Gretchen suggests:

"The Great Alone" by: Kristin Hannah



This is an engrossing story of a family living in the wilds of Alaska. There is some drama and turmoil in the family which kept me turning the pages but what I enjoyed most was the description of just how life is when living in these rustic conditions. The few people living there rely on each other and work together as a community to survive. Interestingly, the

author grew up in Alaska so her description of this life is quite accurate.
