

Ann suggests:


"Bonfire" by Krysten Ritter

"Matilda" by: Roald Dahl (Read by: Kate Winslet)



"Saga, Vol. 1" by: Brian K. Vaughan & Fiona Staples



Equal parts science fiction and fantasy, Saga tells the story of Markus and Alana, star-crossed lovers and soldiers from opposite sides in a never-ending space war attempting to escape their fate and make a better life for their young daughter Hazel. The story is strange and fantastical but still very "real" and emotionally nuanced. It's equally likely to make you laugh out loud

as it is to make you cry. There are currently eight collected volumes of this graphic novel with a ninth coming in October.

Hudson River Valley Heritage Historical Newspapers database provides access to digitized copies of newspapers from the Hudson valley region ranging from 1831 to 2013.

There are over 34,000 issues currently available from 41 different publications including the Rockland County Times and The Journal News.

You access this database from anywhere - even without your library card!

How to get started:

- 1.) Visit our webpage: http://rosememoriallibrary.org
- 2.) From the menu at the top of the page, hover over Research and select Databases from the drop down menu. Then select "Access the Rose Memorial Library Databases." Note: You can also navigate to the databases directly by visiting: http://guides.rcls.org/stpdatabases/
- 3.) Select the Newspapers category, then click on HRVH Historical Newspapers.

From there, you will be able to search by keyword, browse by year/month/day, read single articles or entire issues.
