Even if you've never listened to the podcast before, this book would be an excellent introduction to the wild and wacky

How to Walk Away by: Katherine Center




To paraphrase John Lennon, life is what happens while you're making other plans. That's the premise of this book. The courage exhibited by the protagonist Margaret Jacobsen and the support of family, friends and her physical therapist as a result of injuries due to a plane crash make for a feel

-good story. Center keeps it light enough to keep the tears in check and hope alive - a good read.

All We Ever Wanted by: Emily Giffin

This was a book I couldn't put down! The story centers around a teenager's unfortunate choices at a party one night and the far reaching consequences of those choices on several families involved. What I really liked was the soul searching, introspective, and thought-provoking way these characters traverse this challenge. This is a timely book dealing with the ramifications of social media in modern life and the current "me too" movement activity. This book will definitely make you think.
