- Work in partnership with all our elected officials to provide the best service to all our residents. Protect our natural resources.


Rockland County Legislator, District 1


Kevin G. Nolan, Serve Rockland, SAM

Early Voting will begin with the November 5, 2019 General Election. There will be nine days of early voting:

- Sunday, October 27, 2019 From 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM
- Monday, October 28, 2019 From 12 Noon to 8:00 PM
- Tuesday, October 29, 2019 From 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM
- Wednesday, October 30, 2019 From 12 Noon to 8:00 PM
- Thursday, October 31, 2019 From 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM
- Friday, November 1, 2019 From 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM
- Saturday, November 2, 2019 From 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM
- Sunday, November 3, 2019 From 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM
