March 18, 2026, meeting held for Rose Memorial Library, 5:30pm, in-person, Rose Memorial Library, Kennedy Room.

Present: Amanda Pagan-Glass, Board President; Jackie Hanley, Vice President; Richard Eggers, Treasurer; Beth Pivovar, Trustee; Interim Director, Carole Gomez; Christina Haigh, Secretary (excused absence)

In attendance: Curran Koehler.

Meeting called to order at 5:40pm by Amanda Pagan-Glass, Board President.

I. Approval of Minutes*

February 18, 2026, Monthly Meeting Minutes were reviewed. *A motion made by Amanda Pagan-Glass, second by Beth Pivovar, with unanimous agreement by Trustees to accept the February monthly meeting minutes.

II. Public Comments ~ No public comments

III. Financial Reports*

February 2026 Financial Narrative reviewed by Carole Gomez, RML Interim Director. All Accounts Receivable and Accounts Payable are up-to-date. RML has received the annual funds from the Town of Stony Point. A portion has been transferred into the short-term investment account until it is needed for monthly expenses.

The February Cash Disbursements and Financial Reports were discussed. *Beth Pivovar made a motion, second by Amanda Pagan-Glass, unanimous by Trustees, to accept the Financial Narrative and Reports for the month of February.

IV. Reports ~

a. Director's Report: Carole Gomez, Interim Director.

- February brought more challenging weather with two weather-related closings.**
- In-person visitors, program attendance and circulation have returned to pre-water main break numbers.**

- The annual audit happened on March 3rd with the audit report presentation in May.
- The NYS Annual Report is paused due to the closing of Baker & Taylor. RCLS held a workshop suggesting draft reports should be completed.
- RML contacted ACV Junk Removal. The shed and other items have been removed from the property.
- Dawn, our Communications Specialist, has reactivated our YouTube page created in 2014. She has also joined Peach Jar, a social media site for the NRSCD to post library news once monthly.
- Joy has moved all of her classes back to the Kennedy Room. Watercolors continues to be the most popular. Mahjong has taken on a life of its own.
- Katie's Adult Summer Reading Program is in the works. The Library of Things continues to grow with donated as well as purchased items.
- Susan required some additional personal time. The team ensured that all of her scheduled programs continued supervised by RML staff.

b. Board Reports

- i. **Marketing & Fundraising:** The Charles Eccher Park has been booked for the Summer Celebration & Summer Reading Kickoff on June 28th. A flyer was designed to send to interested vendors. The yard sign has been designed as well.
- ii. **Facilities & Capital Projects:** nothing at this time.
- iii. **Finance & Budgets:** Donations for 2026 YTD total \$575. RML is in receipt of the Town of Stony Point funds.
- iv. **Long Range Planning:** The team has planned layouts for the 117 West Main building.
- v. **Technology:** RML is working with Frontline on the wiring for 117 West Main.

VI. Old Business:

- a. The team completed the layouts for the 117 West Main building,
- b. The Library Director Job Description was posted on the RCLS Jobs page and shared with the surrounding Library Systems. To date, RML received twelve (12) resumes expressing interest. Interviews will start shortly.
- c. The Annual Report to the NYS Department of Library Development is on pause. The due date will be released in the near future. RCLS expects a fast turn-around.

- d. RockWeb has not responded as yet to the inquiry for exact financial numbers for 2026.

VII. New Business

- a. The Emergency & Safety Procedures Policy, presented at the February meeting, was approved with a *motion by Amanda Pagan-Glass, second by Beth Pivovar and the agreement of all Trustees.
- b. The Law Enforcement Policy, presented at the February meeting, was approved with a *motion made by Dick Eggers, second by Jackie Hanley and the agreement of all Trustees.
- c. Approval of the revised Employee Handbook, presented at the February meeting, is scheduled for the April 15th meeting because it requires more information.
- d. It was recommended by Carole Gomez, Interim Director, to amend Susan Babcock's title to Director of Youth Services in view of her dedication to RML and providing outstanding Youth Services programs. The Board of Trustees was in agreement to make this happen effective immediately.
- e. RML has received the proposed Agreement between Rose Memorial Library Association and Beth Sigler Studio Architecture for the project at 117 West Main Street. A *motion was made by Dick Eggers, second by Amanda Pagan-Glass, with agreement by all Trustees, to execute the Agreement.

- a. The Town of Stony Point Board Meeting on March 24, 2026, 7pm at Patriot Hills, will hold a Public Hearing on the re-zoning of the 117 West Main Street property to accommodate the new Rose Memorial Library.

April 15, 2026 Board Report

Carole Gomez, Interim Director

- Our numbers have increased almost back to pre-water main break and taking into consideration the winter weather.
- The Historical Society of the Palisades Interstate Park Region will be our guests at the April 15th Board Meeting.
- The Senior Staff spent much time in March planning the interior design of 117 West Main and meeting with Beth Sigler to discuss our goals.
- The Annual Audit by Berard & Associates took place on March 3rd. Representatives will make a presentation regarding the results at the May meeting.
- The NYS Annual Report has been distributed to all 700 NYS libraries for completion. There is a glitch in the Rose Memorial Library template listing an outlet location in Long Island City NY. RCLS has emailed the DLD to correct this issue. In the meantime, RCLS accepted our completed report for review.
- Dawn, our Communications Specialist, has been successful in keeping the public informed with regular updates on Facebook, Instagram, YouTube and our website. She has now reactivated our YouTube page (last used in 2014). She is currently working on the May eBlasts as well as creating the marketing for the Summer Celebration. A yard sign has been designed and the Vendor flyer. She is currently working on a four-page flyer to be sent to homes early in June.
- Susan planned a full March and April schedule and is looking forward to moving outdoors when the parks open for 2026 on/around April 15th. She has also been planning and ordering supplies for Summer Reading.
- Katie has finalized plans for the Adult Summer Reading Program and created three terrific prizes which will be drawn at random for the participants.
- Joy's classes continue to "pack the house". They show the obvious need for a larger library. Mahjong attendance is full every week. Watercolors continues to be the most popular program. Her movie of the month has grown a following and is also well attended. Joy continues her outreach into the community and has created numerous contacts.
- It has been our goal to demonstrate resilience and stay in the public eye. There are three Stony Point PAL events available for 2026 participation.

Director of Operations

- Total for 2026, RML has received \$700.00 from 7 donors. There is a Thank You To All Donors page on the website and they receive letters for tax purposes.
- Rose Memorial Library has 3,179 registered patrons end of March.
- Twenty-five (25) new cards were issued in March.
- In March, 1,699 in person as numbers increased with better weather.
- March circulation continues to increase year to date.
- Books By Mail Outreach program (now administered by Katie) was utilized by four (4) patrons.
- Monthly use of RML computer services has resumed and we provided patrons with a new public computer. It also continues to increase year to date.
- There were five (5) requests for Notary services. Katie successfully completed the class and the NYS test. She is now also licensed notary.
- Rose Memorial Library continues to offer Proctoring services to several school/training programs: Stanford University, Quinnipiac University, Tulane University, Real Estate University and Pro-Career Center

Katherine Coulter, Adult Collections Librarian & Circulation Supervisor

- Books have been supplied largely by Amazon following the regular ordering schedule, Ingram is still acquiring new sectors to fortify selling and processing services.
- Attached is the summer reading packet patrons will receive during Adult Summer Reading, there will be three prize baskets chosen using the raffle tickets. Winners will be picked randomly.
- I conducted the acquisition of the Home Boost kits, courtesy of O&R. Patrons will plug the widget into their phone and thermal scan their homes to see where they need caulking/better insulation. Normally a \$99 test free through our library now, as well as other libraries in the system.
- Towards the end of the month, I put together the presentation for the architect to get an idea of what types of furniture and equipment we will need for designated areas of the building that will be my responsibility.

Susan Babcock, Children's Services

- Programs have been doing really well this month. Attendance is back to pre-flood numbers, and we're also seeing several new families joining us for programs and signing up for library cards. It's been so nice to welcome both familiar and new faces into the library.
- Starting in mid-April, we'll be moving many of our programs to the park. We're looking forward to this change and the opportunity to continue offering programs in a different setting as we head into spring.

- Behind the scenes, I've been working on organizing the storage closets and taking inventory of supplies. The goal is to use up as much as we can now, rather than packing and moving items unnecessarily as we prepare for the move to West Main.
- Summer Reading planning is already underway, and we have some exciting things lined up. One highlight is that we've secured the Bubble Bus for our kickoff, which should be a lot of fun.
- Overall, it's been a really positive and productive month, and it's great to see so much engagement from the community.

Dawn McFarland, Communications Specialist

- Updated the website carousel "In the Spotlight" template to be more uniform in size and more similar in style with the new books that everyone likes.
- Updated both Staff Picks and In the Spotlight Web carousels
- Updated the blog pages on our website
- Sent out the April email blast for Adult programs
- Made a FB event for the Earth Day Foraging Walk
- Highlighted various programs on social media
- I also edited and added an excerpt on the Anthony Wayne local history lecture to YouTube
- Created a video highlighting adult programs which I added to YouTube
- Created a lawn sign for our summer celebration
- PeachJar: Our flyer was approved by PeachJar after the first flyer was denied due to dating. I tried to get approval in time for spring break and was denied.
- We will be a week behind each month through the end of the school year and will be to date in September. This is because we can only submit a flyer every 26 days and approval process takes 7 days. (PeachJar rules)
- I will continue to add YouTube content to our channel in time for summer programming.
- I will be working on our summer reading brochure during my monthly visit next week.

- In March, we had 285 patrons attending 31 in-person programs.
- We are alternating our monthly weeknight Paint & Sips between The Round Table Brewery and the Stony Point Brewing Company. We are grateful for these local alliances.
- Genre Book Club Selections, Dates & Meeting Places are now out, up until August, as well as the 2026 Book Club list. Both are available on our website and as handouts at the library.

- We have 4 Genre Book Clubs: [MYSTERY: Mystery/Thriller/True Crime; SCI FI: Science Fiction/Fantasy/Dystopian; NON-FICTION: Non-Fiction/Biography/Memoir; FICTION: Fiction/Classics/Historical Fiction]. We rotate genres and meet once a month on a Thursday evening, at a local restaurant. Interested patrons should request to be put on the email list for updates on titles and dates for events. - We are offering a Monthly Movie on Saturday afternoons; however, *we will be changing the location to the Pyngyp Schoolhouse* instead of the Board Room at Patriot Hills. We will continue to focus on documentaries.
- Chair Yoga is going strong up at Patriot Hills, and Gentle Yoga is starting April 15th.
- We are having steady and increasing interest for Mahjong, which we have moved to the library on Fridays, from 10:30am-2pm.
- We have Canasta lessons starting in June.
- We will be partnering with the Office for the Aging to provide a presentation on May 7th, as well as "office hours" on June 10th for seniors to be advised of resources available to them in the County.
