

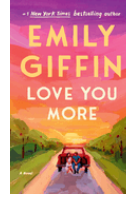

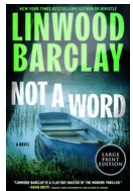


Ransom

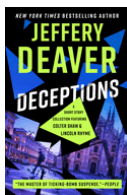

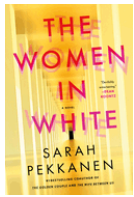
God's Country

**The Thoroughbreds**

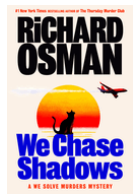

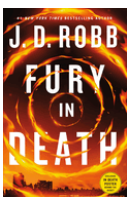

**We Chase Shadows**

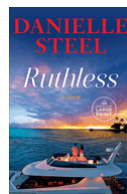
